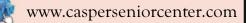

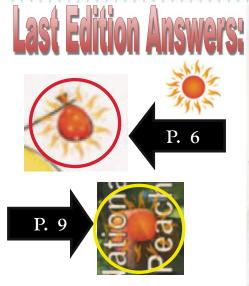

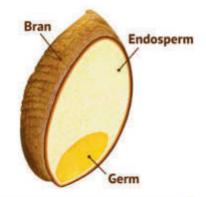


WHOLE GRAIN TIPS FOR SENIORS

Good nutrition is important at every age, and seniors who eat a wide variety of nutritious foods, including whole grains, are setting themselves up for better health.

What is a Whole Grain?

All grains start out as whole grains, but some grains are refined during processing so that parts of their original kernel are removed, stripping away much of the grain's nutrients and flavor. A grain ingredient counts as whole grain if it contains all three parts of the original kernel—the starchy endosperm, the fiber-rich bran, and the germ—in their original proportions.

What happened in 1978?

Year in Review

Major News:

- January 19—The last Volkswagen Beetle made in Germany leaves the plant in Emden.
- February 1st—Harriet Tubman honored on US postage stamp, 1st African American woman
- March 12th—American speed skater Eric Heiden sets world record in 1000m (1:14.99)
- April 7th—Guttenberg bible sells for \$2 million in New York City
- May 3rd—First unsolicited bulk commercial e-mail ("spam") is sent by a Digital Equipment Corporation marketing executive to every ARPANET address on the US west coast
- + June 16—Film *Grease* based on 1971 musical, starring John Travolta & Olivia Newton-John, opens
- July 28—Price of gold surpasses \$200.00/troy ounce for first time
- August 25—Major League Baseball umpires stage a strike that lasts 1 game
- September 11—Janet Parker, medical photographer at England's Birmingham University Medical School, dies of smallpox. (Last known death from smallpox)
- September 17—Anwar Sadat (President of Egypt), Menachem Begin (Israeli Prime Minister), and US President Jimmy Carter sign Camp David Accords, frameworks for peace in the Middle East
- October 25—Halloween, directed by John Carpenter and starring Jamie Lee Curtis in her film debut, is released in US
- November 5—Oakland Raider's coach John Madden wins 100th game, 13th in NFL history
- December 21—Police executing a search warrant find the first set of victim remains in a crawl space under accused (and later convicted) serial killer John Wayne Gacy's ranch-style house.





from What the papacy of John Paul I, 'The September Pope,' could have looked like

When the cardinals gathered to choose a successor to Pope Paul VI, they wanted—not unreasonably—a smiling pope. In the person of Cardinal Albino Luciani, patriarch of Venice, they got one. He took the name John Paul I.

He was selected, according to church historian Eamon Duffy, in the hopeful expectation that his cheerful grin and modest manner would "lift the gloom" that had descended on St. Paul IV—a cerebral, sensitive man who'd grown old amid a swarm of problems, such as theological dissent and departures from the priesthood and religious life.

By contrast, Cardinal Luciani was viewed as a simple, good-humored bishop more nearly St. John XXIII than St. Paul VI in style. The new pontiff took the names of his two immediate predecessors as a sign of respect for both, while choosing as his papal motto the same one he'd had as a bishop—*Humilitas*.

Unfortunately, besides getting a pope with a great smile and a winning demeanor, the cardinals who elected him Aug. 26, 1978 unwittingly picked a man with health issues that only 33 days later would lead to his death, making his pontificate one of the shortest ever.



1978 became "The Year of the Three Popes." On August 20th, 2024, voters in the Primary Election in Natrona County approved the creation of a special tax district, the Natrona County Senior Citizen Service District by a narrow margin:

> 7,148 votes (50.39%) in favor 7,038 votes (49.61%) against

The Natrona County Senior Citizen Service District will provide long-term stable funding to agencies who serve our aging population, ensuring these agencies are able to continue offering/providing the much needed services to Natrona County senior citizens.

With this approval, five trustees will be up for election in November. Interested parties submitted applications to appear on the ballot for the General Election on November 5th.
