Metro Animal Services Fact Sheet — Why is this important to Mills?

Mills is seeking to add a special use tax (spec tax) to the ballot for the construction of a new Metro Animal Control Facility.

Proposition 1 is on the Mills' ballot for a new Metro Animal Shelter. It is anticipated that it will take less than one year to raise the project cost of \$1.25MM. Once the ballot amount is raised, the law mandates that the tax ends.

ONE PERCENT (1%) SPECIFIC PURPOSE SALES AND USE TAX

SHALL THE CITY OF MILLS BE AUTHORIZED TO IMPOSE AN AIRDIDGNAL ONE DERCENT (1%) SPECIAL PURPOSE SALES AND USE TAX, WITHIN THE CITY OF MILLS CITY LIMITS.

PROPOSITION 1

\$1,250,000 AND INTEREST EARNED THEREON TO THE CITY OF MILLS FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW FACILITY FOR METRO ANIMAL OWN THE HE TAX TO CHARFONGE THE SIM OF \$1,750 000 HAS BEEN REACHED, OR THE PERIOD OF TWO YEARS IS REACHED.

Why is this important to Mills?

- Metro is not a Natrona county facility it is owned by Casper and used by Mills, Bar Nunn, Natrona County & Casper
- Mills is a Metro partner, paying monthly to use their facility (\$32,000 annually) to help with strays and hoarding issues. The current facility does not have enough space to address Mills' needs
- Spec Tax will provide Mills a revenue source to improve its animal shelter resources
- Hoarding and quarantine space could remain at current facility with a new building

What are the current Metro building conditions?

- Built for 30 dogs and often houses 50+ animals and is not meeting current needs
- Wooden guillotine doors always in need of repair, unsafe for dangerous dogs
- HVAC system/ Poor ventilation 1 single forced air system throughout the building has led to disease outbreaks
- Building shifting/settling
- Walls crumbling
- Pipes and ceiling exposed (leads to leaks and "waterfalls" when it rains)
- Kennel sizes small and animals are housed, eating, sleeping in the same area where they relieve themselves
- No outdoor space attached to the kennel for relief area.
- Little office space/ No room for meet and greet rooms
- No quarantine space
- No vicious animal safe space
- Metro handles 6,000+ calls and takes in around 2,300 animals annually

What is Metro doing currently?

- Cat condo revamping
- Annexing kennels
- New outside dog run (Utilized in warmer months)
- Overall organization/ cleanliness
- Processes/ procedures working with partner cities to match processes.
