

ORDINANCE NO. 199

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THE WATER COMMISSIONER WITH AUTHORITY TO DISCONTINUE WATER SERVICE FOR USERS FAILING TO PROVIDE THE REQUIRED EQUIPMENT FOR WATER SERVICE, FAILING TO HAVE A WATER METER INSTALLED IN A LOCATION EASILY ACCESSIBLE FOR READING AND REPAIRING, AND REQUIRING NOTICE TO BE GIVEN TO USER PRIOR TO DISCONTINUANCE OF WATER SERVICE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING.

SECTION 1. In the event a water consumer does not comply with the Provisions of Ordinance No. 160, Section 5, entitled Equipment Required for Water Service, or in the event the Water Commissioner, or his duly authorized representative, is unable, with reasonable diligence to gain access to a consumer's water meter for the purpose of reading or repairing said meter, then, in that event, said user shall be deemed in default, and, upon official notice being given him of said default, shall be entitled to an additional period of not more than ten days during which to make said meter accessible to the Water Commissioner, or his authorized representative. At the expiration of ten days from receipt of the aforesaid official notice, and in the event the consumer has not made said meter accessible to the Water Commissioner, or his authorized representative, all water service to the consumer shall be discontinued without further notice. The official notice of default, designated above, shall be in writing and either sent by registered mail to the defaulting consumer, or delivered to him personally by an authorized official of the town. Any persons whose water supply has been discontinued because of default, as provided above, shall be ineligible for water service at the location of the default either for himself or any tenant who may subsequently occupy the premises and wherein the water meter was not accessible for reading and repairing. Ineligibility for water service is to exist and continue until the consumer complies with the prescribed required equipment for water service, and until all expenses incurred by the town in connection with the delinquency, including

the regular fee for returning the water to the users individual lines, shall have been paid in full.

SECTION 2. SAVINGS CLAUSE. If any section, sub-section, sentence or clause of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. ORDINANCES REPEALED. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
