

ORDINANCE NO. 354

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING RECKLESS ENDAN-  
GERING, AND PROVIDING PENALTY FOR VIO-  
LATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF  
MILLS, NATRONA COUNTY, WYOMING as follows:

Section 1. A person is guilty of reckless endangering  
if he recklessly engages in conduct which places another  
person in danger of death or serious bodily injury.

Section 2. Any person who knowingly points a firearm at  
or in the direction of another, whether or not the persons  
believe the firearm is loaded, is guilty of reckless endan-  
gering unless reasonably necessary in defense of his person,  
property or abode, or to prevent serious bodily injury to  
another.

Section 3. Any person who violates the provisions of  
this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and  
shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty  
(\$750.00) Dollars.


